# **Volcanoes and Tropical Forests**

Journey thorough the contrasting Central American countries of Costa Rica and Nicaragua. Hike up volcanoes, discover remote waterfalls, and learn about tropical forests. Look out for the diverse wildlife living in the cloud and rain forests of the area and wake up to the sounds of Howler monkeys. Stay on Ometepe, a volcanic island on Lake Nicaragua, and enjoy the relaxed pace of life there - a contrast to the more energetic pace of the fascinating colonial cities of Leon and Granada.

#### ACCOMMODATION GRADE:

#### Standard

Our standard, mid-range accommodation offers a good level of service, often with other amenities such as a restaurant, bar, garden or swimming pool. Generally rooms will be comfortable with en suite facilities.

#### WALKING GRADE:

#### Moderate

For those who are fit and active, these moderate walks are normally on good paths and tracks at low altitude. Days may include some fairly demanding ascents and descents, so previous experience is preferable but not essential.

#### **GROUP SIZE:**

#### 10 - 16

Maximum group size ranges from between 6 to 20 people, depending on the type of trip, the transport and accommodation used and activities included. We rarely have groups that are smaller than five or six people and the average is 12 people plus an Explore leader.

## DAY 1 - Trip starts in San Jose

Trip start in Costa Rica's capital, San Jose, in the country's Central Valley.

## DAY 2 - Walk in Braulio Carrillo National Park. Drive to Puerto Viejo de Sarapiqui

This morning after breakfast we travel to Braulio Carrillo National Park, where we take a short walk through the tropical forests. This protected area, though only a short distance from the capital, is a significant natural reserve and home to over 500 species of birds and 150 species of mammals, including howler and white faced capuchin monkeys. On our return to our bus we continue our journey to Puerto Viejo de Sarapiqui. Today is an easy introductory walk. We walk for one and a half hours covering three kilometres through tropical forest. Ascent/descent+300m/-300m.

## DAY 3 - Follow trail through primary rainforest at La Selva. Free afternoon

Today we visit La Selva, the Organisation for Tropical Studies' biological station, and follow the trail through their primary forest with a local guide. En route we learn about the flora and fauna here and about the station's research. The afternoon is free and optional excursions include white water rafting, a hike around Tirimbina Reserve and a chocolate tour. Today's walk is also an easy walk through primary forest following a marked trail. We cover six and a half kilometres in approximately three hours.



## DAY 4 - Travel to Arenal. Local walk. Optional thermal baths

This morning after some free time in Sarapiqui we travel for around two hours to La Fortuna, close to Arenal volcano. Arenal Volcano has until recently been one of the world's most active volcanoes, but since 2010 activity has reduced. It however continues to have a dramatic and picturesque presence in the area. It is surrounded by rainforest which provides great hiking and has a large attractive lake to the west, formed as part of a hydro-electric power scheme. In the afternoon we take a gentle walk in the national park to learn about the area. Later we have the opportunity to try one the local hot spring baths. Our walk today covers five kilometres and takes approximately two hours. Ascent/decent+100m/-100m.

## DAY 5 - Hiking in Arenal Volcano National Park

Today we take to the tree tops for Arenal's famous 'Hanging Bridges' canopy hike. This involves walking on suspended bridges and walkways high up in the jungle canopy. A completely different view of the Arenal National Park than the trails on the ground and a great opportunity to view the wildlife that lives in the trees. We should also get some stunning views of the Arenal Volcano itself from up high. Today's hike takes approximately four hours and covers six kilometres. Ascent / descent + 200m /- 300m.



## DAY 6 - Drive around Lake Arenal and on to Rincon de la Vieja National Park

This morning there is the opportunity to take a local waterfall hike, or you may chose to rest at the hotel before we depart, in the late morning, for Rincon de la Vieja. We drive part way round Arenal Lake before heading north- west to another national park with an active volcano, Rincon de la Vieja. Here we stay in a lodge not far from the park entrance.



## DAY 7 - Hike through national park to Blue Lagoon Waterfall

After driving into the park we begin our hike to a local Waterfall. Within the park we will see evidence of steam vents and boiling volcanic mud in 'Pailas' as well as interesting birds and other flora and fauna in the surrounding tropical forest. It is possible to take a swim in the waterfall outside the rainy season. On our return it is possible to include the 'Pailas Loop' to see more of the park. The Waterfall hike is ten kilometres and takes approximately four and a half hours. Ascent / descent +200m / - 200m. The additional Pailas Loop is another four kilometres and two and a half hours.



## DAY 8 - Cross the border to Nicaragua. Take ferry to Isla Ometepe

Today we leave Costa Rica, crossing over into neighbouring Nicaragua. We travel to Lake Nicaragua, one of the world's largest freshwater lakes, and take a ferry across to the volcanic island of Ometepe. Ometepe has been home to indigenous tribes and cultures for many centuries, demonstrated by the pre-Colombian petroglyphs and artefacts found here. The island was made from the formation of two volcances - Concepcion (1610m) and Maderas (1394m) that give the island its distinctive profile as you approach the island by boat. On Ometepe we stay in a small natural reserve on the shoreline. On arrival we take an easy walk around the nearby lake to a viewpoint. Our stroll around the lake takes approximately forty-five minutes and covers two kilometres.

## DAY 9 - Hike through cloudforest to San Ramon Waterfall

After breakfast we drive to the start of today's hike to San Ramon Waterfall. The waterfall is on the southern slopes of Maderas Volcano, about four kilometres from San Ramon village. We walk through dense jungle, home to howler monkeys and a wide variety of birds and butterflies, some of which are endemic to the area. The waterfall is most impressive during the rainy season when there is the most water but remains a beautiful spot throughout the year. Along the way to the waterfall we will see the pipes from the local hydroelectric station. The crystal clear water from here is also bottled for drinking. Todays hike is eight kilometres and takes approximately four hours. + 400m / - 400m.



## DAY 10 - Ferry back to mainland and drive to the colonial city of Leon

Today we take the ferry back across the lake to drive north-west to the colonial university city of Leon, home to the countries main universities. In the afternoon we take a walk around the fascinating old town with its historical buildings, churches and cathedral - listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site.

## DAY 11 - Four-wheel drive through Los Maribios and volcano hike on El Hoyo

Our walk today is on a distinctive volcano - El Hoyo can easily be recognised from a distance by the large hole in the on one of its slopes, and is actually a complex of several volcanic structures, the most significant of which are two round craters and several fumaroles. We arrive to the start of our hike by four wheel drive through Los Maribios, Nicaragua's impressive volcanic chain. As we ascend we will have views down over other volcanoes and Lake Managua, the large lake to the north of Lake Nicaragua. Our hike today takes approximately four hours and covers five kilometres.

## DAY 12 - Drive to Granada, one of Central America's most beautiful cities; explore on foot

Granada, on the shores of Lake Nicaragua, was founded in 1524 and is thought to be the second oldest Spanish city in Latin America. Today much of the city centre has been renovated and it has a pleasant, relaxed atmosphere. On our arrival we take a tour of the city including the Merced church and a local market. The rest of the day is free to explore this attractive city further or relax in one of the many cafes.



## DAY 13 - Four-wheel drive and hike along the Puma Trail on a walking tour of Mombacho Volcano

Covered by cloudforest, Mombacho Volcano can be seen from Granada. This morning we drive to the top by four wheel drive and visit the scientific station there. We then take a guided hike along the Puma Trail, learning about the volcano and the flora and fauna found in this special environment. From the top there are stunning views down to Lake Nicaragua. This volcano hike is four and a half kilometres and takes four hours. Ascent/descent+100m/-100m.



## DAY 14 - Free day in Granada

Today we have a free day in Granada. Possible optional excursions include a boat trip through Las Isletas on Lake Nicaragua, and kayaking.

The rainy season is from May to November and the summer from December to April, but it does still tend to rain, usually in short bursts. ## Clothing

Lightweight clothing is essential for most of the year, though a warmer jumper is advisable for cooler evenings at higher altitudes. A good lightwaterproof is essential, and you could consider waterproof trousers. The jungle lowlands are hot and muggy, and it can rain at any time of year. Long trousers and long-sleeved shirts are recommended on jungle walks.

## Footwear

We recommend you bring lightweight walking boots with ankle support, make sure that your boots are worn-in and comfortable before the start of the trip. Also trainers or sandals for relaxing and general wear. We suggest that on international flights you either carry your walking boots in your hand luggage or wear them - should your luggage be lost or delayed, your own boots are the one thing that will be irreplaceable.

## **Visa Information**

Costa Rica: Citizens from the UK, US, Canada and most E.U countries do not require a visa for a stay up to 90 days. Citizen of Australia, New Zealand and the Republic of Ireland do not require a visa for stays up to 30 days. Nicaragua: Visas are not required for UK, New Zealand, Australian, US and Canadian citizens. There is an entry charge of 10USD. Other nationalities should consult the relevant consulate. USA: (including those in transit) Citizens of the UK, New Zealand, Australia, Canada and passport holders from several EU countries can enter the United States without a visa under the Visa Waiver Program (VWP) - where you apply for an ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorisation), which applies if you enter the country by sea or by air. This must be done on line - https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov no later than 72 hours prior to travel. Travellers who have not registered before their trip are likely be refused boarding. You must have an electronic passport with a digital chip containing biometric information about the passport owner. UK passports which are biometric feature a small gold symbol (camera) at the bottom of the front cover. If you have visited Iraq, Syria, Iran or Sudan since 2011 or are dual nationals of these countries, you cannot travel with an ESTA and instead you will need to apply for a visa from the nearest US Embassy or Consulate. If you are unable to provide a valid visa before boarding flights to the US, or entering via another method, you may not be permitted to travel. Please note for your ESTA application you will be required to supply Point of Contact information. Explore's USA contact information will be listed on your final documentation
