

Family Romanian Winter Adventure

This short winter break heads into the heart of the Transylvanian Alps. We learn winter survival lessons and how to make bread as well as wildlife tracking. There are a couple of treasure hunts around Bucharest and Sighisoara to bring these sightseeing trips to life along with the chance to try ice skating in the capital. The highlight of the trip is a visit to Bran Castle, better known as the setting for Bram Stoker's Dracula and a night by Balea Lake. PLEASE NOTE This departure does not stay at the Ice Hotel but spends the night at a hotel close by. We will visit the Ice Hotel during the trip to see how the rooms are created from huge blocks of ice each year.

- ★ Carpathian Mountains Learn some winter survival techniques and try out sledging

ACCOMMODATION GRADE:

Standard

Our standard, mid-range accommodation offers a good level of service, often with other amenities such as a restaurant, bar, garden or swimming pool. Generally rooms will be comfortable with en suite facilities.

TRIP PACE:

Moderate

Moderate pace tours are ideal if you want a holiday which combines exciting activities and experiences with plenty of time to relax and unwind. Typically you'll be active and busy for part of the day but then also have time to rest and recharge your batteries.

GROUP SIZE:

10 - 16

Maximum group size ranges from between 6 to 20 people, depending on the type of trip, the transport and accommodation used and activities included. We rarely have groups that are smaller than five or six people and the average is 12 people plus an Explore leader.

DAY 1 - Join tour Bucharest

Known for its wide tree-lined boulevards and grand buildings, Bucharest is a bustling metropolis. Romanian legend has it that the city was founded on the banks of the Dambovita River by a shepherd named Bucur, whose name literarily means 'joy'. His flute playing reportedly dazzled the people and endeared him to the locals who decided to give his name to the city.

DAY 2 - Drive to Brasov, visit Dracula's Bran Castle and afternoon wildlife tracking

This morning we drive to the town of Brasov, where we visit the Black Church, city square, the First Romanian School Museum and the town's city walls. The school museum is hidden in the gardens of one of the oldest churches in Brasov. We then take a short drive to the legendary Bran Castle, built in the 14th century to protect the mountain pass from the invading Turks, the castle is located high above a valley perched on a rock with views over Transylvania. In the 20th century it was the favourite residence of the royal family and is now famous as the setting the Bran Stoker's Dracula. Although Bram Stoker never visited Romania, he depicted the imaginary of Dracula's castle based upon a description of Bran Castle that was available to him at the time and based this $grue some\ legend\ on\ Vlad\ the\ Impaler, a\ prince\ whose\ reputation\ was\ of\ a\ blood-thirsty\ ruthless\ tyrant\ who\ terrorised\ the\ area\ at$ the time - visit if you dare but make sure you leave before it gets dark!. We spend the afternoon on a more sedate quest with a visit to a wildlife tracking centre and accompanied by expert guide we get the chance to see tracks of wild boar, red deer, wolves and bear before arriving in Moieciu for the night.

DAY 3 - Cable car into the area of the Balea Lake. Winter survival lesson and optional sledging

Once we arrive in the heart of the Carpathian Mountains we take a cable car and ascend to 2,034 meters where the hotel is located. The actual journey takes around 30 minutes although the total time taken to transfer the whole group may take longer as the cable car can only take 10 people. The hotel is by Balea Lake with stunning views of the immediate area. We also get the chance to visit the Ice Hotel which uses ice carved from Balea Lac. The Ice Hotel has an ice restaurant, an ice bar and even an ice church, which is created each year from ice blessed by local priests! The bedrooms are entirely made of ice including the beds. In the ice bar, you can purchase drinks served in ice glasses. Once we have settled into our accommodation, we walk to the 'Tunnel Walk' which is on the road tunnel of the Transfagarasan highway (the 90km road is one of the most spectacular roads in the world and has more tunnels and viaducts than any other road in Romania - it was named as the best road in the world by BBC's Top Gear presenters). Although the road will be closed in the winter, you can still see parts of it and we walk through one of the tunnels to see the ice stalactites and stalagmites. Please note this is dependent upon gaining entrance into the tunnel which may not be possible if there is a snow drift. We then meet the Romanian Mountain Rescue Team who teach us a few winter survival skills including putting up a shelter and cooking a meal. There is also an optional sledging activity along a 50-100 metre set route near the Ice Hotel. Although there is no minimum age, younger children need to travel down with a parent. Please note this is weather dependant and can be done the following morning if required.

DAY 4 - Drive to Sighisoara for a treasure hunt and lunch and then onto Viscri where we make bread and a horse shoe

We leave around 10am to catch the cable car back to the base station at Lake Balea. We then drive to Viscri via a stop at Sighisoara which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and also the birthplace of Dracula! We discover the town on foot with a short treasure hunt planned to find the old town fortifications, the Church on the Hill, covered stairs and the clock tower. We then have lunch here and you may want to try the delicious cakes and coffees that the local cafes have to offer and that the town is known for. We then continue driving to Viscri and when we arrive, the Explore Leader gives a short orientation walk of the area. Viscri is a wonderfully preserved village with a fortified church that is listed by UNESCO. If the snow is thick enough we travel by a horse drawn sleigh ride to visit a local bakery where we learn how to make traditional bread and to the village blacksmith where we learn how to make a horse shoe.

DAY 5 - Drive to Bucharest, treasure hunt guiz and optional ice skating

We spend the morning heading back to Bucharest where on arrival we have a treasure hunt quiz around the city that includes visiting the Revolution Square, Ceausescu's Palace, Metropolitan Church and the Old Town. The rest of the afternoon is left free to discover thee city or try out ice skating (optional).



Romania Trips

Climate

Romania's climate is continental, temperatures being strongly influenced by the physical features of the Carpathians. Temperatures will fall from highs of 18°C (by day) to lows of 6°C (at night) in October; by January they will hover around freezing during the day and go down to -10°C at night. They will then rise to reach October temperatures again by April. Temperatures will generally be lower in the mountains than in Bucharest. Snowfall may occur at any time.

Travellers should pack warm clothes (layers will be best), a thick water and wind proof jacket, a jumper/fleece, hat, scarf and gloves. You may also find thermal underwear useful.

Luggage: On tour

One main piece of baggage, a daypack and an overnight bag for your stay at the Ice Hotel are needed. You're main luggage for the night at the Ice Hotel will remain locked in the coach at the cable car base station at Lake Balea. Remember you are expected to carry your own luggage - so don't overload yourself.

We recommend taking a water bottle, torch, camera and personal first aid kit. You may find that walking poles are useful.

Tipping

Booking a land only package with Explore

You may also be eligible for the Free Explore Transfer.

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Insurance

Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling on trips within the United Kingdom.

Vaccinations

Nothing compulsory, although we recommend vaccination against tetanus, hepatitis A, typhoid and polio. Tick-borne encephalitis is recommended by some medical sources if travelling in certain areas of Eastern Europe, at specific times of the year. The Foreign Office currently recommend considerations of vaccination against rabies if travelling in rural areas of Romania. Check latest requirements with your travel clinic or doctor prior to departure. The above is not an exhaustive list.
