Highlights of Germany

On this fast-paced trip you'll get to experience the highlights of Eastern Germany from the capital Berlin right down to Munich in Bavaria. We'll see the main highlights such as Checkpoint Charlie in Berlin, the stylish city of Leipzig, Colditz Castle and the famed cities of Dresden and Nuremberg. We travel by coach but also local train, explore the cities on foot and get off the beaten track and see Neuschwanstein Castle and Konigstein Fortress from an angle that most travellers don't on our included walks to these famed attractions. On our Christmas markets departure you'll get the opportunity to browse the traditional markets in each city we stay in and indulge yourself in spiced gingerbread, warm gluhwein and tasty roasted sausages. We also visit Annaberg-Buchholz in the Erzgebirge Mountains, which is known as the cradle of German Christmas traditions and has one of the most beautiful Christmas markets in Germany.

Maximum group size ranges from between 6 to 20 people, depending on the type of trip, the transport and accommodation used and activities included. We rarely have groups that are smaller than five or six people and the average is 12 people plus an Explore leader.

DAY 1 - Join trip in Berlin

Our trip begins in Germany's capital city, Berlin. After checking in to our hotel and meeting the group, this evening is at leisure for you to enjoy your first taste of the city's restaurants and nightlife. After the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989 Auguststrasse was able to establish itself as a trendy gallery district and here you'll find a variety of restaurants in historic buildings that you might like to dine in this evening. If you're booking your own flights then please ensure that you let us know whether you're arriving into Berlin Schonefeld or Tegel Airport so we can arrange your transfer accordingly

DAY 2 - Berlin walking tour; free afternoon to perhaps cycle the Berlin Wall

This morning our Explore Leader will take us on a walking tour of some of this city's main attractions including the Rotes Rathaus City Hall and the Nikolai Quarter, which is the oldest residential area in the city. We'll also see the Berlin TV Tower and Berlin's largest city square, Alexanderplatz. Around this square are buildings constructed by the German Democratic Republic in East Berlin as part of their vision of a 'new socialist utopia'. We continue through the Lustgarten Pleasure Gardens and from here we can view the domes of Berlin Cathedral and Museum Island. We then walk down Berlin's grand avenue, Unter den Linden to see the Baroque buildings from the Prussian era and the famous Brandenburg Gate. Other sights include the moving Holocaust Memorial, the site of Hitler's Bunker and finally, we see Germany's most beautiful square, the Gendarmenmarkt and Checkpoint Charlie, which used to be the crossing point between East and West Berlin. This afternoon is free for you to further explore this large city and its many attractions. It's easy to get around using the metro and public buses. You may like to visit the East Side Gallery, which is

1.3 kilometre long section of the Berlin Wall that has been kept as a monument to peace, or perhaps the Berlin Wall Memorial. If you'd prefer to be a bit more active, then a great way to see the city is by bike and you can choose to join a bike tour from the Prenzlauer Berg District to see the most impressive Berlin Wall sights on Bernauer Strasse including the Memorial Centre. You'll also be able to visit some of Berlin's many famous Christmas markets such as Weihnachtszauber at the Gendarmenmarkt, which is popular for handmade trinkets and cheeses and you could try a cup of hot white chocolate milk or some fried apple. Another option would be the oldest of the markets, Berliner Weihnachtszeit at Roten Rathaus, where you can ride the Ferris wheel or try your hand at ice skating. One of the smaller and less commercial markets is Lucia in the courtyards at Kulturbrauerei, which has a Scandinavian feel to it.

DAY 3 - Train to Dresden via Leipzig; walking tour of Dresden

Today we leave Berlin and take a local train to Leipzig in Saxony. On arrival our Explore Leader will take us on a walking orientation tour to see Europe's largest railway station -Leipzig Central, which was built in 1915 and the Old City Hall, which is now part of the Stadtgeschichtliches Museum. We'll also see the historic fair trading and exhibition buildings, Naschmarkt (market square), the Goethe Memorial statue and the lovely Saint Nicholas Church. After spending around three hours in Leipzig we'll hop back on the train to Dresden and take a taxi from the station to our hotel. After checking in our Explore Leader will take us on a walking tour to get our bearings and see the Rococo styled Zwinger Palace, Semper Opera House, Kreuzkirche Lutheran Church and Dresden Castle. We'll also visit Neumarkt, which is an area that was largely destroyed by Allied bombing during World War II and the firestorm which followed. The Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady) survived this but sadly collapsed a few days later. During the proceeding Soviet era this area in the heart of the Old City remained empty apart from the ruins of the church which were left as a memorial site, but it has now thankfully been fully restored and is once again a beautiful area to explore. On our Christmas departure you'll be able to visit Striezelmarkt, Dresden's most famous Christmas market and one of the oldest in the country. It's known best for its stollen cake, which is definitely worth sampling. You can also buy a variety of other culinary treats including gingerbread cookies, roasted nuts, deep-fried dumplings and of course a glass or two of gluhwein (mulled wine). You'll also find a range of wooden crafts, Christmas gifts and decorations, incense smokers and handmade candles.

DAY 4 - Free day in Dresden; chance to take the train to Konigstein Fortress

Today is free for you to explore Dresden. Perhaps this morning you'd like take the train to near Konigstein Fortress and from the station you can enjoy a pleasant climb on a hiking trail to the castle, which is perched on a rock plateau above the Elbe River. You can easily spend a couple of hours here to explore the castle complex and if you want to learn more then there's the option to hire an audio guide. Following your visit you can walk back to the train station along the old fortress road. In total the walk will take around 2.5 hours, covers 6 kilometres and has a maximum ascent/descent of 300 metres. This afternoon you may like to take the train to Meissen, which is a 35 minute journey away. Meissen is also situated on the Elbe River and is most famous for its porcelain which has been manufactured here for centuries and for its pretty hilltop castle. Back in Dresden itself perhaps you'd like to join a cruise along the Elbe to Blasewitz (it takes approximately 90 minutes). Some of the ships used on this route are traditional steam boats, which give you a real sense of travelling in a bygone age.

DAY 5 - Visit Colditz and Christmassy Annaberg-Buchholz; arrive in Nuremberg

This morning we drive to Colditz Castle for a guided tour. This Renaissance castle gained notoriety in World War II when it was used as a prisoner of war camp. After our tour and a little free time here for you to have lunch we drive to Annaberg-Buchholz in the Erzgebirge Mountains, which is known as the cradle of German Christmas traditions and has one of the most beautiful Christmas markets in Germany. Here you can buy locally made wooden toys, Erzgebirge figurines and handmade lace from Plauen as well as trying delicious potato pancakes and chubby sausages. After time here to explore we drive on to Nuremberg where we stay for the next two nights. This evening is free to make your first discoveries of the city, known for its Medieval architecture including its almost completely intake old city walls.

DAY 6 - Nuremberg walking tour; chance to enjoy a beer tasting

This morning our Explore Leader will take us on a walking tour of the old city to see some of its most iconic buildings and the Hauptmarkt market square where we'll find 'the beautiful fountain'. This 14th century fountain looks like a mini Gothic cathedral and according to local folklore if you turn the golden ring attached to the railing three times and make a wish, it will come true. This afternoon is free for you to discover more. Perhaps you'd like to visit the Documentation Centre Nazi Party Rally Grounds, Nuremberg Castle or walk the city walls (they're 5.5 kilometres long). Or perhaps you'd like to take group tour of the Hausbrauerei Altstadth underground rock-cut beer cellars and enjoy a beer tasting. Another culinary option would be to take the gastronomic walking tour 'the taste of Nuremberg', which lasts around 3 hours and you'll get the chance to enjoy some food samples along the way. Nuremberg is home to Christkindlesmarket held in Hauptmarkt Square. Here you'll find around 180 stalls full of Christmas handicrafts including 'Nuremberg Plum People' which are little figurines made from prunes and culinary delight such as spicy gingerbread, fruit loaf and roast sausages.

DAY 7 - Visit to Neuschwanstein Castle and Royal Castles walk; Munich orientation tour

This morning we drive to Neuschwanstein Castle where we have a 30 minute guided tour followed by time for you to explore on your own and grab some lunch. The castle is the epitome of a traditional fairy tale castle, which was built for show rather than any strategic or defensive purposes. We then take a circular walk up through the impressive Pollat Gorge to view the royal castles of Neuschwanstein and Hohenschwangau from the Marienbrucke Bridge. Our walk will take around 1 hour 45 minutes, covers a

length of 4.5 kilometres and has a maximum ascent/descent of 215 metres. Next we will continue the drive to Munich, the capital of Bavaria, which is probably best known for its beer festival, Oktoberfest, but there is far more to the city than that. Munich centre is easily walkable and retains a small town feel. This evening our Explore Leader will take us on an orientation tour of the Old City to see the Frauenkirche and Saint Peter's Churches, Marienplatz Square which is home to the very ornate New City Hall, Alter Hof (the old court building), the central square of Odeonsplatz and the Munich Residenz, which was formerly a Bavarian royal palace. After a busy day you may like to visit Hofbrauhaus, which has a traditional beer hall dating back to the 16th century. Here you can sample a wide variety of traditional German beers and hearty food such as white sausages, boiled beef and apple strudel.

DAY 8 - Trip ends in Munich

The trip ends after breakfast at our hotel in Munich. Your transfer to the airport today will either be by local train or by taxi. The local train service is very efficient with trains running every 10-20 minutes and reaching the airport in just under 45 minutes. Depending on the time of your flight, you may want to enjoy some of Munich's numerous attractions. You could take a stroll through the English Garden, which is one of Europe's biggest city parks. At the Residenz Museum you can learn about Bavaria's rulers from 1508 right up to World War I or you could revisit the city's biggest landmark, Frauenkirche Church, which dates from 1488 and although it was damaged by bombing in World War II it's been reconstructed and remains the spiritual heart of Munich. If you're looking for something a bit more unusual then you can visit the only second-hand traditional clothing shop in the city, Holareidulijo where you might pick up a pair of Lederhosen. Or perhaps you'll choose to visit the Olympiapark which was built for the 1972 Summer Olympic Games.

Clothing

In spring and summer, lightweight clothing is best during the day plus warmer clothing for colder nights. We also recommend taking a lightweight raincoat and an umbrella. During autumn and winter layers work best. In winter we recommend taking a hat,

gloves, scarf, fleece/jumper and a thick waterproof and windproof jacket.

Footwear

Comfortable walking shoes and sandals or trainers for relaxing. If you're travelling in winter then it may be slippery underfoot, so please ensure that your footwear is waterproof and that it has a good grip.

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

This holiday is designed to acquaint you with the highlights of Eastern Germany in just 8 days. On Day 3 we'll be using trains between the cities to experience travelling like the locals do and you'll need to be able to carry your luggage on/off the trains. Most of our explorations within the towns and cities visited are done on foot and there are also a couple of included walking excursions as well, so please bring sensible footwear and be prepared for the busy nature and amount of walking involved in this enthralling holiday. Where we have included walking tours to introduce you to the main sights of the cities/towns visited you'll get to see the wonderful exteriors of the buildings listed in our trip notes. Following the tour they'll usually be some free time for you to go back to any that you'd like to take a more in depth look at and to pay the entrance for the attraction to see the inside.

Non refundable permits

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Vaccinations

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against tetanus, polio and hepatitis A. Tickborne encephalitis is recommended by some medical sources if travelling in certain areas of Europe, at specific times of the year.
