

Highlights of Norway

Towering cliffs, ice-capped mountains and deep blue fjords make up a landscape so majestic it almost defies belief. Using the very efficient public transport system we experience travelling by train, boat, bus and on foot. Our journey takes us along the most spectacular of train lines including a trip on the famous Flam Railway and the scenic Raumabanen Railway. We explore a land carved by glaciers and vibrant cities on this journey to discover Norway's Highlights.

Our standard, mid-range accommodation offers a good level of service, often with other amenities such as a restaurant, bar, garden or swimming pool. Generally rooms will be comfortable with en suite facilities.

TRIP PACE:

Full on

Full on paced trips are for travellers who like their holidays packed with activities and experiences, moving on quickly from place to place with lots of early starts and long, busy days. Some may find them tiring, but others get a buzz from packing their precious holiday-time as chock-a-block full of new experiences as possible!

GROUP SIZE:

10 - 16

Maximum group size ranges from between 6 to 20 people, depending on the type of trip, the transport and accommodation used and activities included. We rarely have groups that are smaller than five or six people and the average is 12 people plus an Explore leader.

DAY 1 - Join tour in Oslo; guided walking tour

Welcome to Oslo, Norway's capital city for more than 700 years. The history of the city dates back to the middle ages and the earliest buildings still standing today are over 1000 years old. As well as the pretty Scandic architecture Oslo is in a wonderfully scenic location at the end of the Oslo fjords and surrounded by pristine forest. On arrival at Oslo Airport today, we will independently collect our train ticket and catch a train into the city centre where will we take a 15 minute stroll to our centrally located hotel. This afternoon the trip will start with a guided tour to make the most of our fleeting visit in this historic city including a visit to Bygdoy peninsula by ferry to see the Viking Ship Museum. Later this evening, there will be an abundance of choice for your first Norwegian dinner. If you'd like to see the city at a more leisurely pace and visit a number of other highlights, you may wish to extend your trip by one or two nights' by booking a pre-tour stay with us in Oslo.

DAY 2 - Travel on the scenic Raumabanen Railway and Trolls Road to Geiranger

After breakfast we depart by train from Oslo to Lillehammer, the host town of the 1994 Winter Olympics. The journey then heads north through the Romsdalen Valley and continues from Dombas on the spectacular Raumabanen Railway along the Rauma River all the way to Andalsnes. The railway is 114 km long and travels over the Kylling Bridge. From here we'll take an iconic bus journey towards Geiranger, along the Troll Road, one of Norway's best known tourist attractions. The road has 11 turns and the highest point is 858 meters above sea level. Dramatic, exciting and the ultimate scenic experience is the best way to describe it. A short ferry crossing will take us to the Eagle Road and on to Geiranger.

DAY 3 - Hike above Geiranger Fjord to admire the view before a cruise on the

Adventure awaits us, as we start out on the water of Geiranger Fjord surrounded by breathtaking scenery and waterfalls. The boat will drop us off at a small inlet, from which we will begin the 4-5 hour walk back to Geiranger, via the historic Skagefla farmstead. The walk is demanding in places along well marked, sometimes steep, paths but is worth every step for the unparalleled views and a sense of sitting on top of the world. Once back in Geiranger we will have a well-deserved lunch break before departing by public bus to our next stop, Alesund.

DAY 4 - Travel along the beautiful West Norwegian fjords

Today is all about the journey, as we travel through Norway's picturesque fjords with noticeable scenery changes the further south we go. We will experience the West Norwegian coastal landscape on our way from Alesund to Skei by private bus via Briksdal Glacier. On arrival in Briksdal, we will hop on to the much-loved Troll Cars that will transport us into Jostedal Glacier National Park to great viewpoints around the glacier. Part of the grand Jostedal Glacier, Briksdal Glacier cuts its way down the valley before melting into the river below. We have some time to admire our stunning surroundings before we continue on to the small village of Skei. Located on the shores of Lake Jolstravatn and with mountains on the other side; Skei is surrounded by nature at its most spectacular.

DAY 5 - Ride the famed Flam Railway; orientation walk of Bergen

Early this morning we will leave Skei by private bus to Leikanger where we board a boat for the relaxing journey to Flam. We'll travel through the beautiful Sognefjorden into Aurlandsfjorden surrounded by green hills, rocky cliff edges and pretty waterside houses. We then catch the Flam Railway to Myrdal on the Hardangavidda plateau. On the 20 kilometre train ride we experience some of the most magnificent Norwegian nature. We can see rivers that cut through deep ravines, waterfalls that plunge from the steep cliffs of the snow-capped mountain slopes, as well as farms clinging on to the mountainside. The Flam Railway is one of the world's steepest railway lines on normal gauge tracks. Nearly 80% of the route is on a 55% gradient, with twisting tunnels that spiral in and out of the mountain. At Myrdal we connect with the train to Bergen. On arrival we have an orientation walk through old city centre, including the fish market at Torget and the historic Bryggen Waterfront a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

DAY 6 - Full day in Bergen to explore with a 24-hour Bergen Card

Today we can enjoy a full free day in Bergen to explore. Norway's second city offers many attractions and sights including the Hanseatic harbour Bryggen, Floibanen Funicular, Troldhaugen, the Fish and Flower market and Gamle Bergen (Old Bergen Open Air Museum) all of which can be visited using the included 24-hour Bergen Card. The card also offers reduced rates to many other attractions and museums.

Climate

Seasonal Climate Despite the northern latitudes the climate in Norway is not extreme, due to the affects of the North Atlantic Drift. Between May and September is the best time to visit this region, with summer temperatures reaching the high teens and rain a regular feature year round along the coast. North of the Arctic Circle the sun does not set between the middle of May and the end of July, so you can expect to encounter the midnight sun during this period.

Budgeting and packing

Clothing

Light and medium clothes are needed, including a warm sweater and windproof jacket, as the weather can vary considerably on a daily basis. Rain gear is essential at any time. Evenings, nights and early mornings can be cold at the beginning and end of the season. Other items that may prove useful are gloves, a warm hat and lightweight thermals.

Booking a land only package with Explore

You may also be eligible for the Free Explore Transfer.

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.
