Northern Lights with Expert Astronomer

Expert astronomer, Andrew Green, accompanies this trip to Iceland in search of the spectacular Northern Lights. By day, we\II explore the famous 'Golden Circle' including Thingvellir National Park, Gullfoss Waterfall and Strokkur Geyser, and learn about the volcanic eruption of 2010 at Eyjafjallajokull Museum that caused chaos around the world, as well as unwind in the geothermal waters of the Blue Lagoon.

ACCOMMODATION GRADE:

Simple

These are often small, family run establishments or campsites which provide a no-frills experience with adequate amenities and service standards. Sleeping arrangements are simple, sometimes with en suite facilities.

TRIP PACE:

Moderate

Moderate pace tours are ideal if you want a holiday which combines exciting activities and experiences with plenty of time to relax and unwind. Typically you'll be active and busy for part of the day but then also have time to rest and recharge your batteries.

GROUP SIZE:

12-18

Maximum group size ranges from between 6 to 20 people, depending on the type of trip, the transport and accommodation used and activities included. We rarely have groups that are smaller than five or six people and the average is 12 people plus an Explore leader.

Itinerary

DAY 1 - Join trip at Keflavik airport and visit the Blue Lagoon

Meet at Keflavik airport. We start our trip directly from the airport by driving to the famous Blue Lagoon where we get our first glimpse of Iceland's volcanic scenery whilst relaxing in the warm geothermal waters. After a refreshing bath we will drive to the accommodation where we stay for the next two nights. We'll make a stop along the way for you to purchase dinner. Our accommodation has been especially chosen for its location so that we can maximise our chances of seeing the Northern Lights. If the lights make an appearance tonight you'll be woken to witness this amazing sight. Please Note: On some departures the Blue Lagoon will be visited on day 4 instead of day 1.

DAY 2 - Explore the south coast; expert lecture on the Northern Lights

This morning we visit the Eyjafjallajokull Museum that is located at the base of the glacier famed for the volcanic eruption here in 2010 that caused wide spread travel disruption due to the ash cloud it produced. The volcano is now quiet again and the museum here was setup by a local family to document the past events and features an interesting video that shows how the local people were affected. Following our visit we continue to Vik I Myrdal to marvel at the rocky beach with its incredible basalt cliffs. This is a great stop for photos on the wind swept beach. We'll stop nearby for you to buy lunch before visiting Skogafoss waterfall and the Skogar Folk Museum. This quaint museum is home to 12,000 artefacts as well as life-size examples of traditional Icelandic houses with turf roofs, a church and school. Next we stop at Seljalandsfoss waterfall before heading back to our hotel. This evening Astronomer Andrew Green will give a presentation and explain the Aurora Borealis.

DAY 3 - Golden Circle tour before arriving in Reykjavik

Today we go to the famous Golden Circle, which includes three of Iceland's most iconic sights. The order of the day may depend on weather conditions. We will visit the magnificent Gullfoss Waterfall, cascading down in the white-coloured Hvita River that originates at the Langjokull Glacier. We then continue to Haukadalur, home of the Great Geysir and the reliable Strokkur Geyser that erupts with 3 to 7 minute intervals, spouting boiling water to a height of 25 to 35 metres. Passing Laugarvatn Lake we arrive at Thingvellir National Park, home of Iceland's ancient Viking parliament and listed as a UNESCO's World Heritage Site. Here we take a walk to experience first-hand the geological wonder of the Mid-Atlantic Ridge. After free time nearby for lunch we will go to our next guesthouse in Kruines, on the outskirts of Reykjavik, chosen because it potentially offers the best view of the Northern Lights. We'll have time to check-in and freshen up before heading into the capital for a short tour of the city. After the city tour you can either choose to return to the guesthouse with our driver for dinner (wild trout from the Ellidavatn is a very popular choice) or to stay in Reykjavik for your last meal in Iceland and to soak up the city's atmosphere by night. If you choose to stay in Reykjavik you will need to arrange a taxi at your own expense to return to this evening's guesthouse, as it is not walkable to the city centre. There is also the option to go on a Northern Lights boat trip later this evening. On leaving Reykjavik Harbour, we head into the North Atlantic with views back over the city lights and surrounding mountains as we search for the prime location for viewing for the lights. We will hear about the folklore and superstitions surrounding this stunning magical light show as well as the scientific facts that make it possible. Warm overalls are provided as it does get cold at night and can be windy out at sea, so please wrap up warm with plenty of layers and gloves and a hat are essential. There is a warm and cosy seating area inside the boat where we can warm up with hot drinks that can be purchased on board. This trip is subject to the right weather conditions so if it is too windy out at sea, then we will do a similar trip by bus.

Climate

Iceland has a cool and temperate climate and, despite its location just south of the Arctic Circle, its northerly latitude is counteracted by the warm waters of the North Atlantic Drift which encircles the island. Temperatures in winter can fluctuate between about 10°C and -10°C and precipitation in the form of rain, sleet or snow is to be expected at any time. Days will be short, with daylight often only guaranteed between about 11 am and 4 pm in December. The best time for seeing the Aurora Borealis is October to March. Summer is generally cool with average temperatures for June and July around 12 - 15 degree centigrade in Reykjavik, although is known to be warmer in other parts of the country. In June and July you can enjoy continuous daylight and see the Midnight Sun, whilst late spring and early autumn offer long twilights.

Reykjavik: Northern Lights boat trip - 9900ISK without a pick-up transfer or an extra 2000ISK to have transfers arranged.

Clothing

Weather conditions can change rapidly - sunshine, drizzle, rain and snow may all occur in the same day. Temperatures can drop to - 20 degrees centigrade. You'll need warm clothing for outdoors and cold evenings watching the Aurora Borealis. A warm wind and

waterproof jacket and trousers are essential. Thermal layers, jumper, hat, gloves, thick socks and scarfnood are all important.

Footwear

Walking boots with sturdy tread and trainers. Soft indoor shoes are recommended as it is normal in Iceland to have special house shoes.

One main piece of baggage, a soft grip bag is ideal (not a framed rucksack) and a small daypack.

Equipment

We recommend you bring a small torch, sunglasses and a medical kit. We also recommend taking your camera and to get the best pictures of the Northern Lights it is advisable to take a tripod and use a camera with a long-exposure setting. A towel will be provided at the Blue Lagoon for use during your visit.

Booking a Single Room

All of our group tours are planned and operated on a twin-share basis, meaning that the standard cost is based either on individual travellers sharing accommodation with another group member of the same sex, or people who book together sharing accommodation. Please refer to the tour notes where the single room option availability is detailed on a night by night basis for this tour, and the price for the available nights is detailed on the dates & prices tab by departure date. For Self-Guided trips the Single Room supplement offers the option of a single room each and is charged per person. The Single Room supplement also applies to the third person in a party of three that will be accommodated in a single room.

On this tour we use simple accommodation. The majority of hotels in Iceland are decorated in a plain style and many weren't originally built as hotels, but were instead converted from things such as old schools. Rooms can be small and the facilities can be basic. Most accommodation won't have hairdryers or teas and coffee making facilities in the room and some may not have a television, but the scenery outside is so stunning that after a busy day exploring you're unlikely to miss having one. Due to the recent considerable rise in tourism in Iceland, hotels are experiencing very high demand for rooms. For this reason we would like to emphasise that hotel accommodation is subject to change, and we may need to change your night stops with little or no notice. Explore are working hard to grow and develop relationships with the hotels we use, to ensure our bookings are honoured whenever possible. In the case of unavoidable hotel changes we will endeavour to always provide accommodation of the same or a higher standard.

Joining Tour Abroad
