

Walking in Newfoundland

Newfoundland, an island on the edge of wilderness, jutting into the North Atlantic - famed for its coastal scenery, icebergs, sea stacks, prolific birdlife and whales. Known as 'the Rock\ to the locals, we explore the East Coast Trail on foot, linking isolated communities who still speak with an Irish accent. Stay in two bases, St John's - perched on a fjord and famous for its old fashioned bars, and Trinity where depending on the season we take a zodiac to see icebergs or whales. Pack your walking boots and head to Canada's best kept secret.

ACCOMMODATION GRADE:

Standard

Our standard, mid-range accommodation offers a good level of service, often with other amenities such as a restaurant, bar, garden or swimming pool. Generally rooms will be comfortable with en suite facilities.

WALKING GRADE:

Easy To Moderate

This grade is ideal if you want to enjoy both easy and moderate level walks on the same tour. You'll be walking mainly on good paths and at low altitude, with occasional more demanding ascents or descents.

GROUP SIZE:

8 - 13

Maximum group size ranges from between 6 to 20 people, depending on the type of trip, the transport and accommodation used and activities included. We rarely have groups that are smaller than five or six people and the average is 12 people plus an Explore leader.

Itinerary

Itineraries on some departure dates may differ, please select the itinerary that you wish to explore.

DAY 1 - Arrive in St John's, optional hike to Signal Hill or Quidi Vidi

Arrive in St. John's Airport and check-in to our hotel. Depending on your time of arrival, there is the option to hike up to Signal Hill and back, or do a detour by Quidi Vidi and come back in town using the public bus or a taxi. It's a 17 minute walk from the hotel to the Signal Hill Visitor center or to the North Head trailhead, from here the Citadel trail footpath takes you to the summit of Signal Hill past the Queen's Battery and Barracks and provides a breathtaking view of St. John's Harbour.

If you are in for something a little more challenging, walk from your hotel to Outer Battery Road to reach the North Head trailhead. It follows a trail along the narrows to the North Head that may have been in use as far back as the 1500s. Finish your journey from Signal Hill to Quidi Vidi village and stop at the local bar or pub for a break and a taste of local crafted beers. The Explore Leader will leave directions for the walks at the hotel and will meet us in the hotel reception before dinner this evening.

Back in St. John's; welcome to the oldest port city in North America, and our base for the next three nights. Its steep streets are perched on a fjord like bay, the terraces of multi-coloured-houses tumble down to the water. The city's name has been attributed to the feast day of John the Baptist, when Italian navigator and explorer John Cabot was believed to have sailed into the harbor in 1497 and called the region 'New Founde Lande.' Also learn why this Canadian Province has plenty of stories of skirmishes between the British, Irish, Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish and French since Basque whalers first fished here in the early 1500's. This is a reason for Newfoundland's one of a kind accent!

The walk today is approximately 2 km and will take 1 hour with 145m of ascent and descent.

DAY 2 - Drive to Cape Spear, hike along East Coast trail to Maddox Cove, return to St John's

This morning we drive 40 minutes to Cape Spear, North America's easternmost point. The drive south from St. John's passes a typical Newfoundland fishing community along the coast. Historic Cape Spear Lighthouse is meticulously restored and holds the distinction of hosting Newfoundland's oldest surviving lighthouse. We visit Cape Spear with its lighthouses, museum, and berry grounds, in season it is possible to spot whales from a high ridge. We then hike to Maddox Cove: keep an eye out for eagles as the path weaves up and down the steep, wooded slope of Big Cove. Today's hike takes us on a variety of hilly terrain, with big views and a boardwalk bog crossing along the shore at Staffordside, and two river crossings. The trail passes through a Nature Conservatory area in Maddox Cove. As this hike is close to Saint Johns it is a short drive back giving us some free time this afternoon to walk around the city or to visit Quidi Vidi if not visited yesterday. Downtown St John's is famous for its relaxed but slightly down-at-heel bars which echo a different era - and unlike many North American cities and towns is an easy place to get around on foot.

The walk today is approximately 10 km and will take 4 to 6 hours with 450m of ascent and descent.

DAY 3 - Drive to Brigus Head, hike to Admiral's Cove

This morning a two hour drive take us to the start of our walk on part of the acclaimed East Coast Trail - identified by National Geographic as one of the 10 best adventure destinations in the world a few years ago. The twisting paths of this trail pass towering cliffs and headlands, eroded sea stacks, deep fjords, and a natural wave-driven geyser. Along the trail we'll search for seabird colonies and experience an exceptional blend of wilderness adventure, outstanding natural beauty, culture, and history.

Our hike takes us along the coastal Brigus Head path from Brigus South to Admirals Cove. The trail starts in the small community of Brigus South. Along the way we'll pass sandy beaches, walk on high cliffs with stunning views, see abandoned settlements, meadows and beaches. During June & July, visiting finback and humpback whales circle Brigus Bright, using its natural net shape to trap caplin, a small fish. Our path follows high cliff edges and passes over gulches and we return to St. John's at the end of day. This evening why not try the local dish of cod tongues (they taste better than expected!) with a shot or two of Screech Rum, historically brought back from the Caribbean in return for salted fish. With luck we might be able to listen to a local folk band in one of the downtown bars

The walk today is approximately 8 km and will take 3 to 5 hours with 475m of ascent and descent.

DAY 4 - Drive to Trinity: Hike Fox Island Trail, Whale & Iceberg Zodiac excursion

This morning we leave St John's behind us and take the three hours' drive to Trinity on the Bonavista Peninsula, a small and tranquil town in the backwaters of Newfoundland. History, friendliness, and steadfast authenticity are woven into every aspect of the Trinity area, locally known as 'Trinity Bight'. We'll experience special encounters with local Newfoundlanders, from the beautifully restored fishing rooms and saltbox houses, to the lovely people greeting us in the lanes and welcoming us into their homes. English explorer John Cabot is reported to have landed here in 1497, claiming this part of the New World for the King of England and It is difficult to imagine that just one generation ago, this quiet town was a center for international trade, touching economies worldwide. Our early morning transfer will take us to Trinity:

Our first glimpse of the area will be via Fox Island trail. The trail displays the beautiful coastal scenery, views of the surrounding communities and local wildlife. Fox Island consists of two short trails (Upper and Lower), we begin with the Upper Trail which takes us to the top of the town's central point, Gun Hill, providing spectacular views of Trinity, adjacent communities in Trinity Bay and their protective harbor. The Lower Trail gives us a different perspective of Trinity as we break through a wooded area and come out into the clear to view the historic community. Parts of the trails are a little difficult but well worth the hike. We have a picnic lunch in the village.

This afternoon we head out to sea in a zodiac boat for some whale watching and iceberg observation (see season information below). We'll spend the evening back in Trinity. This historic town is an authentic fishing community with architecture seemingly unchanged since the 1800s with houses, museums, art galleries, and other historic buildings remain preserved from the 19th century.

The walks today are approximately 7 km in total and will take around 3 hours with 100m of ascent and descent.

DAY 5 - Skerwink trail, sea stacks & Puffins on the Klondike Trail

Today we'll wake early for a memorable sunrise hike along the Skerwink Trail. This coastal trail features sea stacks, whales, eagles, and icebergs (in season), as well as views of Port Rexton and Trinity. The Skerwink Trail loop skirts the north and south coasts of Skerwink Head, a rocky peninsula that separates Trinity's harbour from Port Rexton's. The trail is also situated in an historic area, one of the first places to be settled in Newfoundland, in the early 1600s. Trinity's magnificent harbour-which we'll see during the last third of the trail-made this area one of the most defensible and desirable in eastern Newfoundland. By the late 1700s, Trinity was a humming mercantile center, flanked by communities inhabited by fishermen, merchants, sea captains, tradesmen, and their families.

After the hike, we drive to visit the Puffins on the Klondike Trail, an easy to moderate trail from Elliston North to Spillar's Cove that follows an old railway branch line formerly connecting the towns. It has both inland and coastal scenery while providing ample opportunities to view the rugged coastline, sea stacks, whales, seabirds and a variety of animal life. Today ends in Bonavista town, where we'll visit the red-and-white striped lighthouse of Cape Bonavista. The site still employs a light keeper today, who, as in 1843 when it was built, continues to watch out for icebergs, ships, and whales. This lighthouse is one of the few in the world where visitors still can climb up the stone tower to see the same oil-fueled light used centuries ago. There will be time to explore charming

Bonavista and we'll stay here for dinner, one option is to try moose burgers at the Bonavista Social Club restaurant!

The walks today are approximately 11 km in total and will take 4 hours with 90m of ascent and descent.

DAY 6 - Kerleys Harbour, Random Passage and drive back to St. John's Airport where trip ends

This morning we explore Kerleys Harbour. The trailhead is located in the town of New Bonaventure, here the buildings give us a good idea of what life was like in the early 1800's. The old cart road that connected the Harbour with nearby Bonaventure makes up most of this 2km history lesson, serving as the only land link to the surrounding communities, and was probably utilized mainly for winter travel. It is well maintained and offers good views of the rugged coast of Trinity Bay - moose, hares, and birds are common sights along the trail and some areas are still used as a sheep pasture. After the hike, depending on the timing, we'll add another walk either nearby at Roberts Bay or part of the Sugarloaf trail back in St John's. There will be time for a snack and shower before we transfer to St John's Airport where the trip ends.

The walk today is approximately 2 km and will take 1 hours with 125m of ascent and descent - with the option of a second walk of 2 hours.

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Polar, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.
