CARTEUR: Minpopo, The Tuli Block and Northern Kruger 11 days Botswana, South Africa - Trip code BTB

Limpopo, The Tuli Block and Northern Kruger

Travel north from Johannesburg and you'll discover a slice of South Africa that few people explore. Marrying culture and wildlife, the Limpopo Province Nature Reserves and Tuli Block sit on a narrow strip of land bordering Zimbabwe, Botswana and South Africa. The region is known for dramatic rocky gorges dotted with ancient rock paintings sacred to the local Batswapong community.

Most people favour the larger, well known game parks but those who travel a little further north are rewarded with the chance to spot the Big Five without the crowds. This trip crosses between South Africa and Botswana, as does the wildlife that we hope to spot on game drives and walking safaris.

Trip highlights

- ★ Goo Moremi Discover sacred waterfalls and look out for endangered Cape vultures on a walk through this dramatic gorge in the one billion year-old Tswapong Hills
- ★ Big Five Search for wildlife, including rare white rhino, on game drives and walking safaris in Marakele, Mapungubwe and Kruger national parks
- ★ Northern Kruger Stay near Crooks Corner, where the borders of South Africa, Zimbabwe and Mozambique meet and criminals in the early 1900s would dodge capture by hopping between countries
- 🔶 🔹 Palapye Explore the ruins of the old town including the Old London Missionary Church and the museum
- ★ 🛛 Tuli Block Spend time looking for wildlife in this lesser-visited region, home to the Big Five and a huge variety of birdlife

ACCOMMODATION GRADE:

Simple

These are often small, family run establishments or campsites which provide a no-frills experience with adequate amenities and service standards. Sleeping arrangements are simple, sometimes with en suite facilities.

TRIP PACE:

Moderate

Moderate pace tours are ideal if you want a holiday which combines exciting activities and experiences with plenty of time to relax and unwind. Typically you'll be active and busy for part of the day but then also have time to rest and recharge your batteries.

GROUP SIZE:

10 - 16

Maximum group size ranges from between 6 to 20 people, depending on the type of trip, the transport and accommodation used and activities included. We rarely have groups that are smaller than five or six people and the average is 12 people plus an Explore leader.

DAY 1 - Join trip in Johannesburg. Drive by 4WD to Marakele National Park

Our trip begins this morning in Johannesburg and we drive northwards to Marakele National Park, set in the heart of the Waterberg Mountains in South Africa's Limpopo Province. Marakele translates as a 'place of sanctuary' and is home to a variety of wildlife. We'll be travelling in Toyota landcruisers which seat 8 people plus the driver/guide and we'll begin to look for wildlife as soon as we enter the park. We can hope to see several species of antelope, chacma baboon and vervet monkey as well as lion, elephant and rhino. There is plenty of birdlife to spot as well and the region is home to the world's largest colony of Cape vultures, approximately 800 breeding pairs. Fewer tourists make the effort to travel north; instead favouring the well-known southern parts of Kruger, however with just a short drive we'll escape the crowds of jeeps and can focus on our search for wildlife.

Our camp today is simple; we sleep in permanent tents each with 2 single beds and simple en-suite bathrooms. All linen and towels are provided and we will take our meals in the camp in a communal area.



DAY 2 - Take a morning walking safari and afternoon game drive

This morning we will join a guide for a walking safari. We start early, usually around 7am, before the heat of the day kicks in and animals hide away in shady spots. There are various walking routes and the plan is kept very flexible, the guides will work out the best plan for that day given tracks and recent sightings. The walk will be between 2-3 hours long and on flat terrain - the exact distance will depend on what we spot as we go. As we walk our guide will point out tracks, teach us about the habits of the wildlife in this area. Exploring on foot allows us to fully engage our senses as we listen for animal calls and search for tracks.

We'll return to the lodge mid-morning and have time to relax and take lunch. In the late afternoon we'll go out for a game drive allowing us to cover a larger distance and search for lion, elephant and rhino alongside plenty of bird life. We'll be out for between 3-4 hours, again this depends on what we spot along the way!

The maximum group size for the walking safari is 8 people so depending on the size of the group we are likely to be in two smaller groups today. One will walk in the morning and game drive in the afternoon, and the second group will do the reverse.

DAY 3 - Cross in to Botswana and explore Goo-Moremi Gorge

We have a long drive today as we leave South Africa and cross in to Botswana, we expect it to take around seven hours but we will take plenty of breaks and stop en route for a picnic lunch.

We'll arrive and check-in to our campsite in the late afternoon and then head straight out for a walk to stretch our legs. A guide will take us in to part of the gorge which is surrounded by acacia trees and bushveld - a sub-tropical woodland that covers large parts of the Limpopo and Tuli Block regions. We will walk along some hilly terrain, but the paths are clear and the hills are not too steep. We will set up to cover a 5km route and hope to spot the baboons, rock rabbits or dassies that live in the cliffs as we walk.

Our accommodation tonight will be in permanent fixed tents, a cross between camping and a simple hotel room are tents are twin share with beds and all bedding provided. Each tent has a bathroom space with a shower and flushing toilet.

DAY 4 - Discover an abandoned capitals, gorges, waterfalls and 70,000 year rock art


This morning we'll visit the site of Old Pahalapye which was once an important capital of the Bamangwate people in the late 1800s and many artefacts have been uncovered in recent years.

Although there are no guarantees we then hope to be invited to meet one of the local communities who are beginning to work on conservation in the region-this will be on invite only and is dependent on the community, who might have other commitments. This cannot be arranged prior-in keeping with Motswana culture

After lunch we will take another walk in to the hills of Goo-Moremi Gorge, this time in to an area which is sacred to the local bushmen. Before we can begin our walk we request permission from the local headman and all being well we will follow a trail to three waterfalls. The largest of the falls is ten metres high and collects in a deep lagoon surrounded by ferns and lush vegetation. Along the way we'll be able to see rock paintings done by the San people which date back 70,000 years.

The walk is challenging in places with some rocks that we will need to clamber over and some narrow sections of path. We will cover around six kilometres and expect this to take us four hours. For anyone now wanting to do the walk it is possible to spend the afternoon relaxing at camp.

DAY 5 - Return to South Africa and walk in Mapungubwe National Park, part of the Tuli Block

A three hour drive today see's us cross back in to South Africa and to Mapungubwe National Park, part of the Tuli Block region. The park is set at the meeting of the Limpopo and Shashe Rivers, close to the border with Botswana and Zimbabwe and known for its special landscape of sandstone formations, forests and baobab trees.

We'll stop and visit the site of the Lost City on Mapungubwe Hill - archaeologists have dated the site back to the Iron Age and given the artefacts that have been recovered, including a rhino sculpture covered in gold leaf (not life size!), it is assumed the community were very prosperous at their peak.

After checking in to our accommodation we'll take a walk through baobab trees, through fever tree and acacia forests We'll walk for around 1 hour before returning to our accommodation to relax for the evening.

Tonight we stay in simple, twin share thatched cottages with en-suite bathrooms.



DAY 6 - Take two game drives in to the national park

Today is all about wildlife as we take two game drives to search for the animals and birds that make this park their home. The park is home to lion, rhino, leopard and hyena as well as elephants and numerous species of bird.

After a light breakfast we will leave for our game drive at first light. We expect to be back at the camp about 10am but naturally this will depend on what we find during the game drive, timings will be flexible in order to get the best out of the experience. We will relax at the camp after our lunch and let the heat of the day reduce before heading out on another game drive at approximately 4pm.



DAY 7 - Enter Kruger through Punda Maria gate and take two game drives

A drive of around 5 hours brings us to the well-known Kruger National Park, but we enter from the Punda Maria gate in the north of the park, an area that is usually overlooked by most tourists who favour the southern part of the park closer to Johannesburg.

The region has an interesting history with the well named Crooks Corner being a popular spot for criminals in the early 1900s who would take advantage of the borders of South Africa, Botswana and Zimbabwe meeting and hop between each country to evade capture.

In the late afternoon we will take a game drive. This part of Kruger is known as one of the best places to spot the shy Nyala antelope so we'll keep our fingers crossed we are lucky. We can also hope to spot large herds of elephant, buffalo roaming the plans and the rare TSebbebe and Sable are often spotted in this region. We will spend around 2-3 hours on the game drive and the exact route will be decided on the day accordingly to the guide's advice.

Tonight we stay in simple, twin share thatched cottages with en-suite bathrooms.



DAY 8 - Search for wildlife in the northern most section of Kruger National Park

Starting early this morning we will spent the day on game drives, searching for wildlife in a landscape of baobabs, fever tree forests as well as larger open plains. We can expect to see impala, zebra, buffalo and elephant as well as numerous species of bird.

For dinner tonight we will experience a traditional South African Braai, barbequed meats and vegetables are served and washed down with a cool beer. Tonight we'll experience a traditional braai - a South African barbecue. Cooking outdoors is an integral part of the South African way of life and we will be able to witness the pride that our Explore Leaders have in their braai cooking skills.

DAY 9 - Drive to Magoeboeskloof and take a guided walk in the forest

We leave Northern Kruger early this morning but during our drive we will still search for game as we pass through the park and exit via one of the central gates.

Our destination for the day is Mogoeboeskloof, a mountainous area in Limpopo Province and located at the far northeast of the Drakensberg mountain range. Sometimes referred to as the 'land of the silver mist' the mountains and valleys are often covered in a soft mist, and this moisture has created a lush forest which creates a dramatic contrast to the rest of the bushveld scenery. It will take approximately three hours to drive there and we will check-in to our accommodation before taking a short hike in the afternoon.

We follow clearly defined paths through the mountain valley, we'll walk for around 3-4 kilometres. There are some uphill sections but we will take our time and enjoy the views as we go. We will keep the walk flexible to allow more time as we drive through Kruger as we hope to spot wildlife along the way.

Tonight we sleep in rondavels, traditional circular buildings with thatched roofs. The rondavels are twin share with attached bathrooms.





DAY 10 - Walk along the Swartbos Trail looking for parrots and monkeys

Following a trail known as Swartbos this morning we walk through indigenous forest looking for birds and monkeys. The rare Cape parrot can be found in this region, usually flying in flocks of 20 or more and with a very distinctive shriek. During the walk we'll pass by several striking and unusual natural sculptures; the Cathedral Tree - a strangler vine which has straddled several trees and


resembles a cathedral vault; the Pipe - another strangler vine which has killed the original tree, leaving a hollow tube formed by the vine; and the Knoll, a hill in the centre of the trail which offers great views in all directions.



DAY 11 - Return to Johannesburg where the trip ends

After breakfast this morning we return to Johannesburg Airport, a drive of around four hours, where the trip ends.

Clothing

Clothing should be lightweight. However, a wind/waterproof jacket, a warm fleece or sweater and thermal underwear for night time are strongly advised, as nights, early morning game drives and longer journeys can be very cold, especially in winter (April to August).

All visitors should ensure their passport is machine readable and has two blank pages when entering and leaving South Africa. The South African Immigration officials will not allow child/infant pages to be used for this purpose and visitors without the stipulated blank pages will be denied entry.

Botswana: Visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US and Canadian citizens.

A Tourism fee is to be introduced at all entry points into Botswana, though the government has currently postponed this.
