DAY 1 - Fly from Santiago or Punta Arenas to the Falkland Islands

You can choose to start from either Santiago or Punta Arenas and will fly from Punta Arenas onto Stanley, in the Falkland Islands. You will be met at the airport on arrival and will enjoy a brief tour of Stanley before boarding your ship.

DAY 2 - Falkland Islands/Malvinas

We start the day with a visit to the rarely-visited Steeple Jason Island in the West Falklands, home to the World's largest colony of black-browed albatross. We continue onto Saunders Island, the second largest off-shore islands in the archipelago. Saunders is a working sheep farm, rich in wildlife including four species of penguins. We follow onto Carcass Island which offers amazing bird-watching opportunities, including the endemic Cobb's Wren, the dark ground tyrants, tussac birds and more.

Before we first land on South Georgia, you'll receive guidelines and instructions on the wildlife and some insight on the Antarctic Treaty. Thanks to its position, there are parts of the island chain not covered with snow or ice - providing visitors the chance to see unique flora and fauna. As a true wildlife sanctuary, South Georgia boasts some of the World's largest king penguin rookeries and majestic bird life, including the wandering albatross.

DAY 6 - South Georgia

Despite its isolation, South Georgia and its associated islands have a history to rival most countries. First spotted in 1675, South Georgia was mostly used by whalers and sealers as a site to process their catch. As this industry came to a close, the focus switched to science with Argentina setting up a meteorological office here and the United Kingdom used the islands as a base for exploration.

DAY 7 - South Georgia

With only 30 human residents, the population of South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands is comprised mostly of wildlife. It is important to note that the temperatures are slightly warmer than in Antarctica - even if you don't feel it! - meaning the shores and coastline are the perfect breeding ground for many species. This includes fur seals, penguins, elephant seals and albatross. We time our adventures in South Georgia so that you have the opportunity to see all manner of species interacting. You may spot penguins negotiating the sleeping seals or see the penguin chicks beginning to lose their non-waterproof feathers, so ensure you have your camera at the ready!

DAY 8 - South Georgia

You will have plenty of time to explore the 100,000-strong king penguin rookeries of South Georgia, such as those found at Saint Andrew's Bay and Salisbury Plain - a truly remarkable sight! Lose yourself amongst these gracious-looking creatures which is an absolute highlight of South Georgia. Off-shore there is also the chance to catch humpback and minke whales enjoying the rich waters of South Georgia, which we will attempt to search for on our daily Zodiac cruises.

DAY 9 - South Georgia

For those interested in Antarctic history, this area is key to the Shackleton story. His Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition encountered difficulties in South Georgia in 1916 and Shackleton himself had to abandon his vessel in a smaller boat to find help on the mainland. Amazingly, Shackleton and two others covered 35 km of tough mountainous terrain and Antarctic weather to reach assistance. Sadly, on a following trip in 1922, Ernest Shackleton died in South Georgia and was later buried here in a cemetery in Grytviken.

You will have the opportunity to visit the fascinating whaling museum at Grytviken, as well as pay your respects to Sir Shackleton at his nearby grave. Grytviken was once a Norwegian whaling station and is now the administrative capital of South Georgia. In Stromness and Grytviken harbours, 3000-metre peaks form dramatic backdrops to the remains of these historical whaling stations. As we explore the pristine, kelp-strewn beaches, playful seals and basking elephant seals provide entertainment and there will be ample time to cruise by Zodiac into magnificent sites such as Elsehul Bay, along the north coast of South Georgia.

Kayaking:

Kayaking can be booked as an option at a supplementary fee. This must be booked in advance and through the ship operator directly. Please note, you will need to have some experience of kayaking to participate in this activity.

Photography:

Capture your adventure through your lens and take your photography to the next level with our on-board photography workshops. Includes workshops and one-on-one sessions with our on-board polar photography expert guide. This activity is provided on board at no additional cost. No pre-booking is required.

Clothing

Parkas

You should look for a lightweight, roomy, wind and water-resistant parka with some insulation. Bright colors are more visible - and thus safer - in polar environments.

Gloves

Keeping your hands warm and dry can be a challenge. Thin polypropylene gloves can be worn underneath warm outergloves. This allows you some protection from the cold when removing your gloves to operate your camera etc. We strongly recommend that you bring more than one pair of gloves, in case one gets wet (or lost).

Hat/Cap

Warm, woollen hat/cap to protect your ears, as well as a scarf, neck gaiter or other face protection, such as a balaclava.

Trousers

Water-resistant trousers of coated nylon or, even better, Gore-Tex® are essential for your comfort. They can be worn over your regular clothes to keep you warm and dry. We suggest that you purchase trousers a few sizes larger than you normally wear as you will be wearing them over other clothing. Gore-Tex® or similar fabrics are excellent for keeping out wind and water without trapping excess heat. Rain gear and Gore-Tex® products can be found in any outdoor sport clothing store. In addition to your waterproof trousers, warm ski pants are suggested if you have them. Warm trousers such as jeans, corduroys etc are also good.

Socks

Warm wool socks worn over a thin pair of silk, polypropylene socks should provide enough warmth and insulation for your feet. Bring several pairs of socks, since you will inevitably get your feet wet.

Outer Clothing Woollen, knit or cotton sweaters/tops, polar fleece tops (medium weight), several cotton turtlenecks and T-shirts for layering on and off the ship.

Underclothing

Thermal underwear is highly recommended as it will keep you warm without adding bulk. Most polar travellers prefer a lightweight version.

Footwear

Complimentary waterproof boots will be supplied on-board. However, if you have extra small or large feet, you are advised to bring your own.

Also ensure you take good walking boots and trainers for relaxing.

Visa and Passport Information

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related issues with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

USA (If flights transit): you will need to apply for an ESTA if you are transiting the USA as you will have to disembark and clear immigration before re-boarding for the onward flight.

Citizens of the UK, New Zealand, Australia, Canada and passport holders from several EU countries can enter the United States without a visa under the Visa Waiver Program (VWP) - where you apply for an ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorisation), which applies if you enter the country by sea or by air. This must be done on line - <https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov> no later than 72 hours prior to travel.

Travellers who have not registered before their trip are likely to be refused boarding. When completing an application for transit you should enter the words 'In Transit' with your final destination location in the address line

You must have an electronic passport with a digital chip containing biometric information about the passport owner. UK passports which are biometric feature a small gold symbol (camera) at the bottom of the front cover.

If you have visited Iraq, Syria, Iran or Sudan in the past five years or are dual nationals of these countries, you cannot travel under the Visa Waiver Programme. Instead you will need to apply for a visa from the nearest US Embassy or Consulate. If you are unable to provide a valid visa before boarding flights to the US, or entering via another method, you may not be permitted to travel.

Joining Tour Abroad

Insurance

It is a condition of booking with Explore that you have adequate valid travel insurance. It is your responsibility to arrange appropriate travel insurance and ensure you have read and understood the full terms and conditions of your travel insurance policy to ensure that you are covered for all activities you intend to undertake whilst on the tour, including all optional activities. Your Insurance Policy must fully cover you for medical expenses and emergency repatriation to your home country. Please ensure your policy includes medical emergency helicopter evacuation in the event of illness or injury and covers the entire duration of your holiday. If you are trekking at altitude please ensure that there is no upper altitude limit which may limit or exclude cover for your trip. The cost of many of our Polar Voyages will exceed the capped amount covered by standard insurance premiums and you will be required to pay an additional premium to cover the full value of your trip. Vaccinations

Nothing compulsory, we recommend protection against typhoid, tetanus, polio and hepatitis A. Please consult your travel clinic for the latest advice on Malaria, Dengue and Zika Virus. Please take preventative measures to avoid mosquito bites - these include mosquito repellent as well as long trousers and long sleeve shirts to cover up when necessary. Please note many countries in Central America, South America and the Caribbean require a yellow fever vaccination certificates if travelling from infected areas. Also on the NaTHNaC site there is a list of Countries (and specific areas within a country) which are at risk of infection and a vaccination is therefore recommended.
