Trip highlights

ACCOMMODATION GRADE:

Standard

Our standard, mid-range accommodation offers a good level of service, often with other amenities such as a restaurant, bar, garden or swimming pool. Generally rooms will be comfortable with en suite facilities.

DAY 2 - Drive to Petra via the Desert Highway

Follow the Desert Highway to Petra in time to visit this afternoon. A winding narrow path through the Siq leads you to this incredible ancient city and UNESCO World Heritage Site. Petra has been a focus of settlement since pre-historic times, but it was under the Nabataeans that it reached its apotheosis as a centre for trade. From around the 3rd century BC, the Nabataeans began to abandon their nomadic lifestyle and build a city at Petra. Passing trade not only brought great wealth but also inspired a synthesis of Hellenistic, Egyptian and indigenous architectural influences, resulting in the stunning monuments for which Petra is famous. Your afternoon will be spent exploring the site.

DAY 3 - Free day to explore Petra

Spend a second day exploring the archaeological wonders of Petra. Observe countless tombs, baths, temples and intricate rock drawings, as well as a 3000-seat open-air theatre. Beyond the Treasury the main route passes tombs, dwellings, temples and the central city area, with its colonnaded Roman street. However, two of Petra's most impressive sights are to be found above the valley floor. The Monastery (Ad Deir) is one of Petra's best preserved monuments and the long steep climb to get there is well worth the effort. Equally stunning is the 'High Place of Sacrifice' on the summit of Jebel Madhbah, which affords magnificent views in all directions.

Recommended Currency For Exchange

Sterling and US\$ are widely accepted though exchange rates tend to favour the US\$. It is worth taking some money in cash. You may be able to order Dinars from your bank although the rate will usually be lower than purchasing currency in country.

There are high commission charges on Travellers Cheques on a per cheque basis so if using them we suggest you take high denomination cheques. Proof of purchase may be necessary for encashment of Travellers Cheques.

Booking a Single Room

All of our group tours are planned and operated on a twin-share basis, meaning that the standard cost is based either on individual travellers sharing accommodation with another group member of the same sex, or people who book together sharing accommodation. Please refer to the tour notes where the single room option availability is detailed on a night by night basis for this tour, and the price for the available nights is detailed on the dates & prices tab by departure date. For Self-Guided trips the Single Room supplement offers the option of a single room each and is charged per person. The Single Room supplement also applies to the third person in a party of three that will be accommodated in a single room.

Standard

Light on your pocket but long on authentic experiences, these tours are based in simple, sometimes local-style accommodation. If your idea of adventure travel is to experience real, everyday life then you will enjoy our authentic style of tour. You will have the chance to stay at simple, family-run hotels and guesthouses where the lack of luxury is more than compensated for by the warm welcome and genuine insight into local life.

Ream Hotel

Ream Hotel is located in the business district of Amman. The hotel has restaurant and coffee shop, with complementary Wi Fi in the communal areas. Rooms are comfortably furnished, with TV, coffee-making facilities, en suite and some have a balcony.

Petra Palace Hotel

A locally owned and run hotel, this property offers simple accommodation. There are two swimming pools, one indoor and heated and another outdoor situated within the gardens. There is a buffet restaurant and bar available too. The hotel is also within walking distance of Petra. There is no Wi-Fi available.

Ramada Resort, Dead Sea

The hotel located on the northern shores of the Dead Sea and is ideal for those looking to escape and enjoy some pampering and relaxation. Rooms are spacious with modern furnishings, and guests can enjoy a choice of bar and restaurant. There are three swimming pools, a jacuzzi and sauna and spa offering Dead Sea mineral treatments.

Premium

On Premium level tailor-made holidays you will stay at comfortable mid-range hotels, chosen for their location, ambiance or local character. Your rooms will be clean and well-appointed, with en suite bathrooms and air-conditioning or heating as necessary.

The Grand Palace Hotel

The Grand Palace Hotel is located near to the Royal Culture Centre in Amman's Shmeisani district, near to the main shopping area. Facilities at the hotel include a health club and spa, indoor swimming pool, restaurant and bar. The rooms are comfortable and spacious with Wi-Fi access.

Petra Quattro Relax Hotel

Petra Quattro Relax Hotel is located in Wadi Musa, within a five minute drive of the main gate of Petra. Renowned for its friendly service, the rooms are spacious and modern in design and free Wi-Fi is offered throughout the hotel. Facilities include a fitness centre, spa and indoor pool. The main restaurant serves both buffet and a la carte dishes and there is also a coffee shop. From the rooftop terrace you can enjoy a barbecue while taking in the views over the city. The hotel also offers a shuttle bus service to and from the Petra Visitors Centre.

Holiday Inn Dead Sea

Located on the shores of the Dead Sea, this hotel offers a comfortable stay with many facilities including a choice of restaurants and bars. The well-appointed rooms are modern and spacious. There is a large swimming pool overlooking the Dead Sea, there is also a private beach where you can float in the saline waters.

Indulge

If you are looking for the best of both worlds, with adventurous days and indulgent nights, our Indulge level tailor-made tours may be just the answer. Joining Tour Abroad

The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station. If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. It is a condition of booking with Explore that you have adequate valid travel insurance. It is your responsibility to arrange appropriate travel insurance and ensure you have read and understood the full terms and conditions of your travel insurance policy to ensure that you are covered for all activities you intend to undertake whilst on the tour, including all optional activities. If you are trekking at altitude please ensure that there is no upper altitude limit which may limit or exclude cover for your trip. The cost of many of our Polar Voyages will exceed the capped amount covered by standard insurance premiums and you will be required to pay an additional premium to cover the full value of your trip. Please ensure that you are covered for the full amount of your holiday cost, as insufficient cover could invalidate a claim under the policy.
